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

### **DRAFT MINUTES**

#### **1. The meeting opened at 10:08 A.M. with the Pledge of Allegiance.**

- a. Attendance:
  - I. First Selectman Peter J. Tesei - Present
  - II. Selectman John Toner - Present
  - III. Selectman Drew Marzullo – Present

The First Selectman then greeted and welcomed attendees commenting that it was a Public Meeting of the Board of Selectmen who reserve the right to call on people to pose questions and make comments. Mr. Tesei also remarked that this was the final meeting of the 2015-17 Board of Selectmen term and that the meeting would be expeditious as all three Selectmen were to attend the memorial service for Board of Parks and Recreation Chair Nancy Caplan scheduled for noon at the First Congregational Church of Greenwich.

#### **2. Approval of Minutes**

- a. Minutes of the Regular Board of Selectmen meeting held on Nov. 9, 2017 were moved for approval by Mr. Toner, seconded by Mr. Marzullo. The motion passed unanimously.

#### **3. First Selectman's Updates**

- a. Mr. Tesei said that there was a lot happening this week and per the Town Charter requirements, the Board of Selectmen shall meet once per month. Among the past events, Mr. Tesei mentioned Veterans Day and the ceremony and walk that was planned by the Greenwich Veterans Council.
- b. Mr. Tesei said that on Nov. 13, he welcomed Selectman-elect Sandy Litvack to the office for the first of two meetings during which they discussed various issues including the Board of Education athletic fields situation.
- c. On Tuesday (Nov. 28), Mr. Tesei presented a proclamation to Marie Krumeich who was named Woman of the Year by the Greenwich Woman's Club.
- d. The Board of Estimate and Taxation (BET) Budget Committee also met on Nov. 28 and agreed to release the funds for architectural and engineering plans for the Byram Fire Station renovations.
- e. Mr. Tesei said he met with Sue Baker of the Shellfish Commission regarding the UConn research project in partnership with the Shellfish Commission to place an emphasis on economic development of shellfish-related businesses.
- f. On Nov. 16, Mr. Tesei attended the reopening ribbon cutting ceremony at the Abilus Gift and Garden Center on Glenville Street. He said he is urging residents to patronize the shop for holiday shopping.
- g. Also on Nov. 16, Mr. Tesei attended the Immigration Workshop held at the YWCA.
- h. Mr. Tesei said that on Friday, Nov. 17, he had the opportunity to interface with

nearly 70 third-grade students from Old Greenwich School whom he hosted here at Town Hall.

- i. Mr. Tesei said that moving into the holiday week, with budget preparations, there are several changes with the membership of the CIP (Capital Improvement Projects) Committee. A public hearing regarding what is in the 2018-19 CIP budget, as reflected in the current budget, will be held at 6 p.m., Monday, Dec. 18.
- j. Mr. Tesei said he met again with Selectman-elect Sandy Litvack and took him on a tour of Town Hall from the third floor to the basement so that Mr. Litvack could see all facets of government and the people.
- k. Mr. Tesei said that there was a major development regarding the Parking Services Department on Monday, Nov. 27. He explained that this was the first step of redefining/reorganizing the department and that it was very important to him that the person in charge of the department be made aware of the changes before the budget is publicly released. In the interim, Police Capt. Mark Kordick is handling oversight of the department.
- l. Mr. Tesei said that Nov. 29 was one of the saddest days of his administration with the announcement of the arrest of a Wastewater Treatment Plant employee that was the result of an ongoing investigation of the sewer division of the Department of Public Works. Mr. Tesei then read the press release which is attached at the end of these meeting minutes.
- m. Mr. Tesei said that Dec. 1 starts the new term for the Board of Selectmen with the swearing in ceremony at 10 a.m. On Dec. 4, the new Board will convene for an orientation meeting at 10 a.m. The Board will be taking up several topics of interest over the next several week including the lighting of school athletic fields, Mr. Tesei said.
- n. Upcoming events highlighted by Mr. Tesei include the Dec. 5 Greenwich United Way legislative breakfast during which predetermined questions based upon the agency's Needs Assessment, will be asked of legislators and Mr. Tesei; on Dec. 7 there will be the annual Town of Greenwich employee service awards from 9 to 11 a.m. and at 4 p.m., the Pearl Harbor Remembrance Day ceremony; and the swearing-in of a new Fire Marshal on Dec. 12.
- o. Mr. Tesei also reported that he attended a gala in New York City involving Chinese businesses with Greenwich resident Sheldon Peng and several other Greenwich-area residents who have ties to China.
- p. Sustainable CT, of which Greenwich will become a part of, is setting up a 501c3 nonprofit corporation through the auspices of the Connecticut Conference of Municipalities, Mr. Tesei report.

Mr. Tesei then noted the meeting was the last for Selectman Drew Marzullo. Mr. Marzullo read a statement highlighting various elements of his eight years on the Board. He thanked many people for the support and collegial approach to conducting Town business during his tenure – including Mr. Tesei, Mr. Toner and his predecessor, the late Dave Theis, the Selectmen's Office staff, especially Paula Belmont and Penny Monahan; RTM Moderator Tom Byrne, fellow Democrats Laura Erickson, Debbie Appelbaum, John and Vera Blankley, Sam Tamm, and Christine Edwards. Mr. Marzullo also thanked his husband Reynold, their son Richard. He also wished Mr. Litvack well. During his time in office, Mr. Marzullo recalled meeting President Obama, actor Matt Damon and Prince Harry. He said, "I exit this stage with positive memories and 23 pounds heavier."

Before yielding the floor to state Representatives Mike Bocchino and Fred Camillo, Mr.

Tesei said it is hard to encapsulate Mr. Marzullo's public service career. Mr. Bocchino read and then presented a proclamation from the General Assembly honoring Mr. Marzullo. Mr. Bocchino also thanked Mr. Marzullo for his work on the MISA project at Greenwich High School, The Nathaniel Witherell Project Renew and New Lebanon School.

Mr. Tesei then read a proclamation, announcing that Nov. 30 is Drew Marzullo Day. He said he was not only a colleague but also a friend. He also announced that Mr. Marzullo would continue service to the Town as a member of the First Selectman's Diversity Advisory Committee and as a member of the GCTV Volunteer Committee. Mr. Tesei also presented Mr. Marzullo a framed photograph of Greenwich Point Park.

#### **4. Old Business**

##### **a. Report of the Board of Selectmen Board of Education Section 66/67 Charter Revision Committee**

Mr. Tesei thanked Committee member Alexis Voulgaris, who was in attendance, and the other four Committee members for time. He acknowledged receiving two reports from the Committee and commented that the issue took on a divisive tone during the Election process and that the lesson learned is that it is difficult for people to be dispassionate.

Mr. Marzullo made a motion to postpone the item indefinitely. Mr. Toner seconded the motion.

Mr. Tesei said that approving such a motion essentially kills the item.

Mr. Toner said that he thought this was a productive exercise that got people involved in the discussion about the Board of Education. He challenged people to get involved in the 2019 Board of Education elections. He also thanked Board of Education members Debbie Appelbaum and Laurie Erickson who were in attendance, for their service. Mr. Toner said they were emblematic of the members he would like to work with.

The motion carried unanimously.

At 10:59 a.m., the Board then took a 20-minute recess before resuming at 11:19 a.m.

#### **5. New Business**

##### **a. Appointment of Fire Marshal.**

Mr. Tesei explained the appointment is the result of the retirement of Shawn McDonald. He said that Deputy Fire Marshal Christopher J. Practico was the number 1 candidate.

Upon a motion by Mr. Tesei and a second by Mr. Toner, the appointment was approved unanimously.



## **6. Appointments and Nominations**

There were none.

However, Mr. Tesei said that with the transition of the Board of Selectmen, he would appoint Mr. Toner to the New Lebanon School Building Committee, replacing Mr. Marzullo.

## **8. Adjournment**

Mr. Tesei noted that this marked the end of the 2015-17 term.

Mr. Toner motioned to adjourn at 11:30 a.m.; seconded by Mr. Marzullo, the Board voted 3-0 in favor.

### DRAFT MINUTES

#### 1. The meeting opened at 10:05 A.M. with the Pledge of Allegiance.

##### a. Attendance:

- I. First Selectman Peter J. Tesei - Present
- II. Selectman John Toner - Present
- III. Selectman Sandy Litvack – Present

Following the Pledge, Mr. Tesei greeted and welcomed attendees commenting that it was a Public Meeting of the Board of Selectmen who reserve the right to call on people to pose questions and make comments.

#### 2. Approval of minutes

- a. There was a motion by Mr. Toner and seconded by Mr. Litvack to place approval of the minutes of the Dec. 4, 2017 meeting on the agenda. The vote was 3-0-0.
- b. A motion to approve the Dec. 4 minutes as amended for corrections was moved by Mr. Litvack and seconded by Mr. Toner. The vote was 3-0-0.

Before moving on with the agenda, Mr. Tesei said that wanted to take up item 4 a. under New Business first. He explained that as it is custom, a proclamation and a certificate of appreciation would be presented to outgoing Tax Collector Tod Laudonia for his eight years of service. In his comments, Mr. Laudonia thanked his staff and his wife Jane, and said it was an honor to serve the people of his hometown.

#### 3. First Selectman's Updates

- a. Mr. Tesei said two new fire police officers for the Glenville Volunteer Fire Department – Patrick Rooney and Jennifer Almeida, were sworn in on Dec. 11.
- b. On Dec. 12, Mr. Tesei held a meeting with residents to discuss Porchuck Road traffic. Also attending that meeting were Town Administrator Ben Branyan and Deputy DPW Commissioner Jim Michel. He said that more than 100 hours of study and review have gone into the review of the traffic situation.
- c. On Dec.12, there was the promotion ceremony for Fire Marshal Chris Practico.
- d. Also on Dec. 12, the First Selectman's Diversity Advisory Committee met and began planning for the 9<sup>th</sup> annual Defining Diversity writing contest. The contest has great support from Hearst and other partners including Mary Lee Kiernan and Joan Mockler of the YWCA, Mr. Tesei said. Last year there were more than 80 entries to the contest.
- e. On Dec. 13, the First Selectman's Economic Advisory Committee met and held



- discussions on the planned 2018 financial service/hedge fund conference, the Think Greenwich campaign and the Plan of Conservation and Development.
- f. Also on Dec. 13, the Athletic Field Utilization committee comprised of Town and Board of Education officials met to discuss and review the different stakeholders and their needs for athletic fields, as well as short-, long- and intermediate needs.
  - g. At the Dec. 14 meeting of the Western Council of Governments, there was discussion of Connecticut DOT plans to resurface certain portions of the Merritt Parkway between Lake Avenue and Round Hill Road with an adherent pavement on four curves to help minimize the number of accidents.
  - h. And on Dec. 14, Mr. Tesei and Mr. Litvack attended the final meeting of the 2015-2017 Board of Estimate and Taxation term. Proclamations were presented to four outgoing members – Jim Lash, Art Norton, Nancy Weissler and John Blankley as well as Mary Lee Kiernan, who resigned in January. Mr. Tesei said all five have performed tremendous service to our Town.
  - i. Mr. Tesei also provided an update on the Selectmen holding Executive Sessions. It is the opinion of Counsel that the Board may conduct joint interviews of candidates to Boards and Commissions in Executive Session rather than each Selectman conducting individual interviews.

#### **4. Old Business**

##### **a. 2018 Proposed Parks and Recreation fees – Parks & Recreation Director Joe Siciliano.**

Mr. Tesei opened discussion on the long-standing policy (since 2001) of not providing free beach passes to retired Town teachers. Town Attorney Wayne Fox explained that if that benefit was to be afforded to retired employees it would be better done through labor contract negotiations.

Mr. Litvack said that it seemed to him that anyone who retired after service to the Town should be entitled to receive a beach pass; that he does not understand what the problem is in doing so.

There was discussion that such a policy would be a Pandora's box and open the issue for many other classes of employees.

Mr. Litvack also said that if the classes of eligible employees were defined, he did not see any harm in doing so.

Mr. Fox said he would be happy to set up a time to further discuss the issue with Mr. Litvack.

Parks and Recreation Director Joe Siciliano said that he had not received any questions regarding the proposed fees as outlined in the previous meeting agenda.

A motion by Mr. Toner, seconded by Mr. Litvack, to approve the new 2018 fees was approved unanimously.

##### **b. Revisions to the Board of Selectmen 2018 meeting schedule.**

The Selectmen said they would review their calendars and provide updated availability information to Recording Secretary Barbara Heins so that a revised calendar can be available for review at the Jan. 11, 2018 meeting.

#### **5. New Business**

##### **a. Sustainable Greenwich – Conservation Director Denise**

### **Savageau.**

Ms. Savageau and Conservation Commission member Gary Silberberg made the presentation. Ms. Savageau said that Sustainable CT is modeled after the program Sustainable New Jersey and focuses on economic development as well as environmental sustainability. She said the Town already has been working on this effort and will receive points for each of the efforts/programs it uses. It is a collective effort with other participating communities.

In terms of water conservation, Ms. Savageau said that the Town has been at the forefront of these efforts. The Town also has been engaged with energy conservation and coastal resiliency efforts. In 2018, the Town will be registered as a sustainable community. She also said there are more than 30 environmental groups in Town involved in a variety of efforts including public/private partnerships for recycling and composting.

Mr. Tesei commented that there are many private partners who work to protect the environment and educate people to live more environmentally active lives.

Mr. Toner made a motion, seconded by Mr. Litvack and unanimously approved to have Greenwich become involved with Sustainable CT.

Ms. Savageau said that she will be organizing a Town Hall team that will include representatives from Land Use and the schools.

## **6. Appointments and Nominations**

There were none.

## **7. Executive Session**

Mr. Litvack moved the meeting go into Executive Session to discuss pending litigation and settlement of claims at 10:49 a.m. Upon a second by Mr. Toner, the motion was approved.

In addition to the Selectmen, also attending the Executive Session were Town Attorney J. Wayne Fox, Assistant Town Attorney Eugene McLaughlin, Dr. Jill Gildea from the Board of Education, and Recording Secretary Barbara Heins.

At 12:01 p.m., the meeting came out of executive session.

Mr. Toner made a motion, that was seconded by Mr. Litvack, to resume the regular meeting. The motion was approved unanimously.

Mr. Toner made a motion that was seconded by Mr. Litvack to settle Docket No. HHB CV 16-6036187S-Parcel No. 10-23281 for a tax credit of \$7,980. The motion was approved unanimously.

Mr. Litvack made a motion that was seconded by Mr. Toner to settle Docket No. HHB CV 16-6036188S-Parcel No. 08-1947 for a tax credit of \$5,748. The motion was approved unanimously.

Mr. Toner made a motion that was seconded by Mr. Litvack to settle Docket No. FST CV 16-6029025S-Parcel No. 10-2009 for a tax credit of \$15,845. The motion was approved unanimously.

Mr. Toner made a motion that was seconded by Mr. Litvack to settle Docket No. HHB CV 16-6036235S-Parcel No. 07-2709/S for a tax credit of \$1,300. The motion was approved unanimously.

Mr. Toner made a motion that was seconded by Mr. Litvack to settle Docket No. FST CV 16-6029024S-Parcel No. 01-1316/S for a tax credit of \$2,869. The motion was approved unanimously.

## **8. Adjournment**

Mr. Litvack motioned to adjourn at 12:06 p.m.; seconded by Mr. Toner, the Board voted 3-0 in favor.
