**DRAFT MINUTES**

**1. Call to order.**

The meeting was called to order at 5:07 p.m.

**a. Attendance:**

Wayne Keeney, Ron Carosella, James Joyella, Angelica Arenas, Chuck Zoubek, Peter Bernstein, John Raben, Adriana Harper, Laverne Lord, First Selectman Fred Camillo, Selectwoman Lauren Rabin, Select-person Janet Stone McGuigan, Police Chief Jim Heavey, Barbara Heins.

Absent: Sandy Kornberg.

Mr. Camillo welcomed and introduced the committee. He said our Police Department enjoys a great relationship with the public.

**2. Select vice chair and secretary.**

Mr. Bernstein agreed to serve as vice chair which was affirmed by an 8-0 vote.

The committee agreed to appoint Ms. Lord as secretary.

**3. Schedule meetings for the remainder of the year.**

There was discussion on the frequency of meetings, which Chairman Keeney said would probably be quarterly.

Upon the suggestion of Ms. Arenas, the committee agreed to alternate meeting sites between Town Hall and the Greenwich Police Department. The committee agreed that future meetings would begin at 7 p.m., upon the suggestion of Mr. Bernstein, and upon the suggestion of Mr. Carosella, future meetings would be held on Tuesdays.

The next meeting will be held in Classroom B., the 3<sup>rd</sup> floor of GPD for orientation.

#### **4. New business**

Chief Heavey provided an overview of crime statistics for the year to date. He said he will email his report to the Committee members. Among the highlights: GPD has responded to approximately 10,000 calls for service; 32 DWI arrests since January 1; 50 cars reported stolen; 5 civilian complaints filed with 3 determined to be unfounded.

He also reported the department is down 11 officers; there are 3 recruits attending the police academy and 3 officers have been hired as lateral transfers from other departments.

Mr. Camillo said he is working with the city of Stamford to determine whether it is possible to set up a regional police training academy.

#### **5. Adjournment**

At 5:49 p.m., Mr. Bernstein made a motion to adjourn. Upon a second by Mr. Zoubek, the motion was approved unanimously.
