



Pursuant to the foregoing notice, a special Representative Town Meeting of the Town of Greenwich was held on Monday, July 12, 2010 at 8:00 P.M.(D.S.T.) in the Auditorium of Greenwich High School.

The meeting was called to order by the Moderator Thomas J. Byrne.

The members pledged allegiance to the flag.

The Moderator announced that, as all members had received a copy of the call for the meeting, the reading of the call would be omitted.

Coline Jenkins, Chairman of District 6 presented the following in tribute to the late Ulric Richard Sullivan.

WHEREAS: Ulric Richard Sullivan, a member of the Representative Town Meeting for four terms, passed away on June 7, 2010, at the age of sixty-nine, and

WHEREAS: Ulric Richard Sullivan served District 6 with distinction from 1990 through 1997 as a member of the Building Committee; as an Alternate to the Town Officer and Finance Committees; and as Vice Chair to District 6. He was highly regarded for his committee reports which were factual, analytical, engaging and concise.

His public service started in the Air Force Reserves. Following this, Rick attended American University, and then the Law School of Catholic University of America, all

while working on the U. S. Capitol Police Force. He graduated in 1971 with a Juris Doctorate.

His professional career in New York City was first as a litigator with Sullivan & Cromwell LLP and, for the past 36 years, at the legal department of PricewaterhouseCoopers LLP.

He extended his public service beyond this body, volunteering as board member of the Old Greenwich Association. Rick was known as the voice of reason; he did his homework; he listened. It is said that, “He challenged everyone to get ‘off the dime’ and get things done.”

In our town’s recent Memorial Day parade, Rick Sullivan represented the Old Greenwich Association. He rode in a convertible. His wave “hello” was his wave “good bye.” His life is the fabric of our community.

That the entire membership of the Greenwich Representative Town Meeting join District 6 in honoring Ulric Richard Sullivan’s life and further extend our sympathy to his wife, Marilyn, and his sons, Rick, Sam, John and Bobby.
