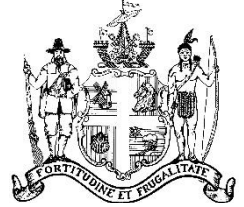

STORMWATER PHASE II MUNICIPAL SEPARATE STORM SEWER SYSTEM (MS4) DRY-WEATHER OUTFALL SCREENING DECEMBER 3, 2018

GREENWICH, CONNECTICUT – The Town of Greenwich, Department of Public Works, Engineering Division is required to complete dry-weather screening for all MS4 outfalls and provide the results to CT DEEP in their annual reports. CDM Smith has been retained by the Town of Greenwich to complete the dry-weather screening and sampling of approximately 1,000 outfalls to be completed by the end of December 2019. CDM Smith will complete the screening with a two 2-person team. Many outfalls will require access through private property. The two 2-person team will knock on the door to seek permission from the property owner to gain access to the outfalls.

The Department of Public Works Engineering Division would appreciate the cooperation of the property owners in completing the screenings. All property owners have the right to refuse the two 2-person team from CDM Smith access to the property. The two 2-person team will have IDs issued by the Town of Greenwich to help identify them.

The dry-weather outfall screenings will begin on **December 3, 2018** in the vicinity of Indian Harbor and proceed east and west along the shoreline of the Town.

The dry-weather outfall screening will not be completed when the ground is covered with snow. Public Works News on the Town of Greenwich website (<https://www.greenwichct.gov/1444/Stormwater-Phase-II>) will list the area of town that the outfall screenings are being completed in.
