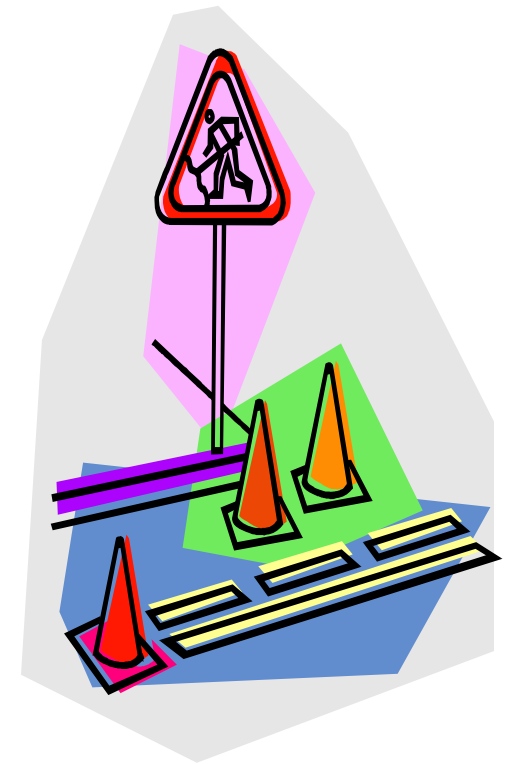

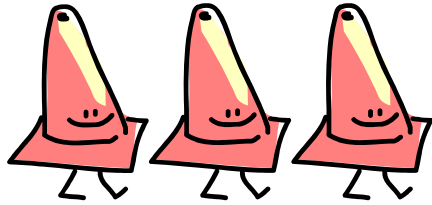

The Department of Public Works will be in your neighborhood soon!

The Sewer Division will be rehabilitating a portion of the Old Greenwich Common Force Main. This work is one segment of the Old Greenwich Common Force Main and includes installing a cured in place pipe liner to rehabilitate the existing force main, provide new service life to the pipe line and limit the amount of excavation work. This force main carries wastewater under pressure from the Old Greenwich Pumping Station.

### WHY IS THIS WORK BEING DONE?

DPW performs maintenance work regularly to improve the Town's infrastructure. In addition, the Town is under a Consent Decree to complete this work. As this is a critical piece of Town infrastructure, the Sewer Division work will provide new service life to the force main for many years to come and improve the reliability.

DPW strives to provide reliable service to the Town and maintenance is important to protect the environment.

### WHEN WILL WORK OCCUR?

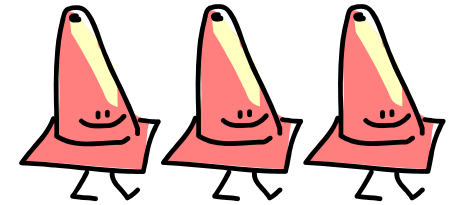
Construction is expected to get underway starting the week of December 2, 2019 (weather dependent). The force main lining installation should wrap up by late March 2020, to be followed later by final paving in Spring 2020. Work is generally scheduled for Monday through Friday during the day. The exception will be the work to install the temporary bypass piping, which is scheduled to occur on the weekend to limit impacts to the local commuters. In addition, installation of the cured in place pipe liner system will require around the clock installation due to the pipe liner curing process.

### WHAT WILL HAPPEN?

A majority of the construction will take place on the north side parking area of the Railroad station. However, there will be some work required on the south side parking area off Oval Avenue. In addition, while a majority of the work is performed using trenchless technologies, there will still need to be some limited excavation work on both the north and south side train station parking lots.

Parking will still be allowed in these parking lots; however certain areas will be restricted during the construction.

Work is scheduled to occur in phases. So there will be periods of time when construction is occurring, and other periods of time when no construction is taking place, as materials are being obtained, etc.
