

Greenwich Avenue Sewer Lining Notice

Town of Greenwich Department of Public Works (DPW) Sewer Division has determined the sewer mains that carry wastewater (water from sinks, toilets, showers, washing machines, etc.) from your building to the Grass Island Wastewater Treatment Plant need repair. Sewer lining work will be performed to restore their condition – no digging required. This process requires significantly less time and resources compared to other sewer repair methods, but there will be some limited disruption to businesses and residences in the area.

When: Sewer lining work is anticipated to start on Sunday, March 5, 2023. Work will occur overnight to limit impacts. During the lining process, individual building connections to the sewer pipe segment being lined will be temporarily interrupted.

Hours: Work will be overnight between 10:00 p.m. and 8:00 a.m. Work is expected to take approximately 8 nights to complete and will not occur on Friday or Saturday nights. This is subject to change due to weather impacts and unforeseen conditions.

Where: Greenwich Avenue from West Putnam Avenue to Railroad Avenue. The work is broken into 8 segments. Please reference the map on the backside of this page for the full work zone.

What You Need to Do During Work on Your Segment

Property owners and tenants in this area must not use water or plumbing facilities during the time of work on their segment of the line.

- DO NOT flush toilets
- DO NOT drain any liquids into sinks
- DO NOT use showers
- DO NOT run dishwashers
- DO NOT run washing machines
- DO NOT use any other facility draining to the sanitary sewer

Why You Can't Use Water During Work on Your Segment

Your building's connection to the Town sanitary sewer main will be temporarily sealed off during the lining process. Not using water use during this time is essential to prevent your building's sewer connection from filling with water and backing up into your property. Also, any water entering the sanitary sewer during this time can negatively affect the lining process and means more time and resources will be required to complete the lining. We appreciate your cooperation.

What Else May Be Expected

The lining process can produce an odor like plastic or glue. Once the lining process is complete, the odor will dissipate. Because this work is being completed overnight, limited temporary traffic disruptions are expected.

Additional notices for each pipe segment with more details on the timing and duration of sanitary sewer service interruption will be provided one day ahead of that segment of lining.



Why Now

This type of work is best completed ahead of paving, which is anticipated in Greenwich Avenue's future. Planned, preventative infrastructure maintenance like this results in a lower project cost, less disruption to the community, and a reduced likelihood of system failure.

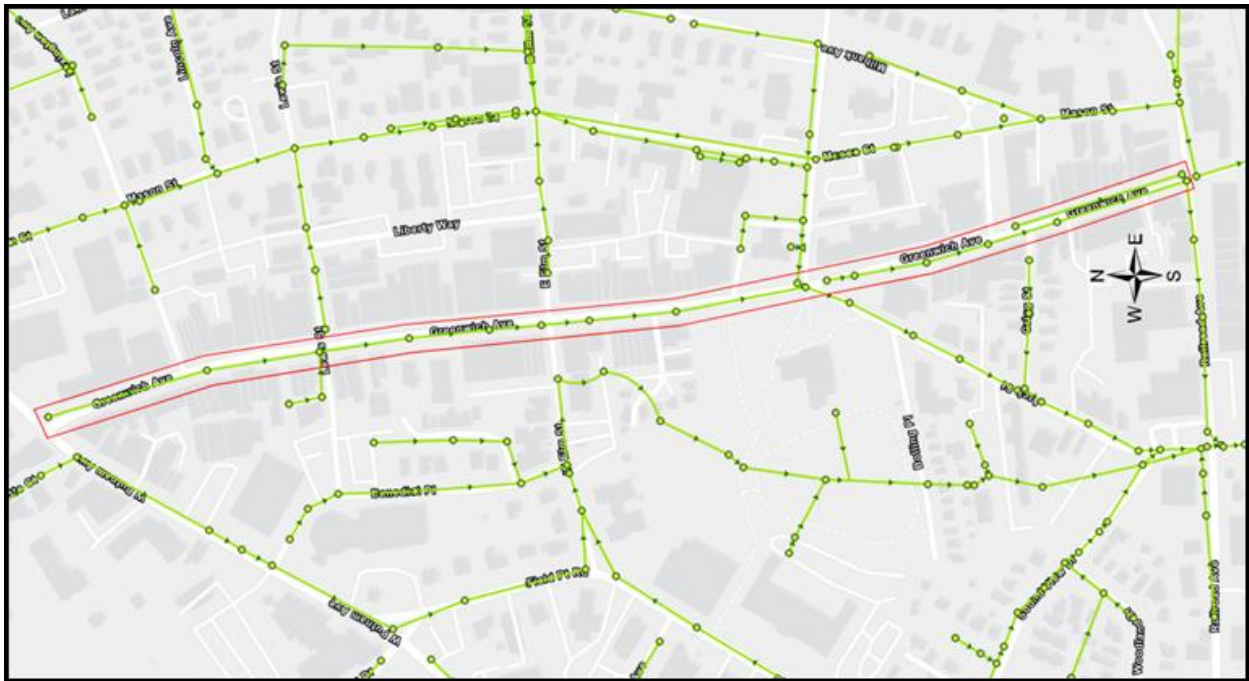
Who is Performing the Work
