Boat LOA Definition

Our boat slips are available based on the LOA of the vessel. The LOA is determined by the total length of the vessel including any attachments such as the bow pulpit, swim platform, anchors, and / or engines in the trimmed down position. Please note that the LOA including all attachments is generally different than the description found on your vessel's registration. If you have any questions about the LOA definition, contact any one of the Dockmasters or the Operation Manager.

Boat Slips

We have boat slips available at the three marinas: Byram Marina, Cos Cob Marina, and Grass Island. Please be aware that there may be a wait list for our facilities.

If you are looking to obtain a boat slip, you will need to apply for a slip through our wait list process. To apply, you will need to visit the Parks and Recreation Department at Town Hall to [Verify Residency](#) and complete a [Marina Facility Waitlist Application form](#). On the wait list form, you will need to describe your boat, including the LOA as described in the previous section. Depending on the size of vessel and your marina preference, please indicate which size slip you are interested in on the waitlist form, and make sure your boat's LOA qualifies for your selection.

Boat Launches

Launching ramps are located at all of our marine locations. All vessels using the ramp, including boats, kayaks, paddle boards, dinghies, etc. must have a current rack, slip, or launch sticker to use the ramp. Please be aware that ramps can be slippery at times due to potential marine growth.

Dry Sailing

Dry Sailing and is available at Cos Cob, Grass Island, and Greenwich Point for boats that are actively being used, at minimum once a month. The boats must be ready for use by June 15th, or whenever it is brought onto the property after the start of the boating season. This means the winter covers must be off, masts must be stepped, and the vessel is in good, operational condition. The trailer must also be in good, towable state, and be an appropriate size for the boat.

Boats that are pulled out of the water from a Town slip or mooring for repairs will have 10 calendar days to complete the repair, and be returned to the water. After 10 days, the daily noncompliance fee will be billed until the boat is removed from the property. A facilities use pass is required. Paddle boards, kayaks or canoes cannot be stored on boats that are dry sailing.

Rack Storage

There is rack storage for kayaks, paddle boards, dinghies, sunfish, etc. at all four of our facilities. Please be aware that there is a waiting list for the racks. To get a rack storage, you will need to apply through our wait list process. To do this, you will need to visit the Park and Recreation Department at Town Hall to provide proof of residency and fill out a wait list form.

If you have questions about proof of residency, please see our "Verify Residency" section. If you are currently on the waiting list for rack storage and you would like to use your kayak / paddle board / dinghy at one of the town's facilities, you can apply for a Facility Use Permit. This will allow you to use the boat launches to access the water.

Slip and Rack Availability

As space becomes available, Dockmasters will call residents off of the waitlist to offer / assign the slip or rack storage. Once you are assigned a space, you must pay for the slip in full at the Town Hall Parks and Recreation office prior to using.

If you are on a wait list for one of the boat slips, but would still like to use the Town of Greenwich Facilities to access your boat during the summer, there are two other available options which are: use of a mooring, or dry sail. If you would like to use your kayak or paddleboard but do not have a rack space, you can launch your kayak from the Town boat launches with a valid Facility Use Permit.

Trailer Storage

Trailer storage is available in all of the marinas from April 15th through November 15th. The trailers must be empty, and cannot be used to store anything on it. Stickers must be placed on the top side of the tongue. Large (greater than 36 feet) 'gooseneck' trailers are not permitted. Empty trailers may not be stored on Town property outside of these dates listed, daily noncompliance fees will apply.

Winter Storage

Winter storage is available at all of our facilities from September 1st through June 15th. Please contact the Dockmaster at the location you are interested in storing your vessel. You must have a current Facility Use Permit for each vessel to be stored. Preference will be given to returning residents. Payment is required prior to haul out, please contact the Dockmaster for winter storage requirements. If the boat is still on the facility after June 15th, weekly late fees will apply.

*There is no summer land storage for vessels. All vessels (except vessels on racks and vessels engaged in dry sailing) must be removed by June 15 of each year to avoid fines.
